Bob Barr for President

Denver - The Libertarian Party has nominated former Congressman Bob Barr as its candidate for president for the 2008 election.



"I'm sure we will emerge here with the strongest ticket in the history of the Libertarian Party," Barr stated in his victory speech shortly after being selected as the Party's nominee. "I want everybody to remember that we only have 163 days to win this election. We cannot waste one single day."

More than 650 Libertarian delegates met in Denver from May 22 till the 26 for the 2008 Libertarian National Convention. After six rounds of voting Sunday afternoon, Barr was selected as the Party's presidential nominee.

"We're proud to present to the American voters Bob Barr as our presidential nominee," says Libertarian Party spokesperson Andrew Davis. "While Republicans and Democrats will fight for their own power in November, Libertarians will fight for Americans. Bob Barr is one of the strongest candidates in the Party's 37-year history, and we look for him to have an enormous impact in the 2008 race. Republicans and Democrats have good reason to fear a candidate like Barr, who refuses to accept the 'business-as-usual' attitude of the current political establishment. Americans want and need another choice, and that choice is Bob Barr."

House Bill 738 passed out of committee unanimously. This is a great sign of progress. As many other bills it failed to get on the calendar of the House floor.

We intend to continue in our work until we have reduced ballot access restrictions in Alabama.

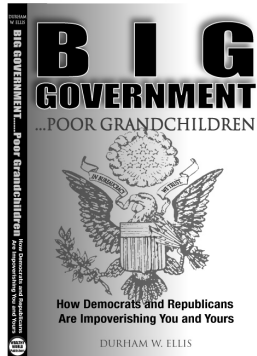

Why should a radical Libertarian support Bob Barr?

I have been a self-identified Libertarian since 1988 when I cast my vote for Ron Paul. When I officially joined the LP in 1990, it was a learning experience, to say the least. Because I was moderately libertarian by Nolan Chart standards, there was sufficient room to grow and become educated on the finer points of property rights, self-ownership, and the Non Aggression Principle. Attending my first county LP meeting in October of 1990 awoke me to possibilities of human freedom not yet considered in my mind. In due time, I grew stronger in my libertarian beliefs. No longer would I be satisfied with merely getting off the “Freedom Train” at whatever stop was convenient for me; I was on until it reached the final destination! Radical Libertarian? You're damned right!

Looking at the campaign of Bob Barr, I see much of myself in him. The vast majority of his life has been spent outside the libertarian sphere of influence and now he finds himself willingly in that sphere, learning and growing. No one forced me to join the Libertarian Party and no one forced Bob Barr into the party either. I believe intent says a lot here: joining a political organization that has had (at best) pitifully small victories speaks more to a sincere alignment with the ideas of liberty than it does the seizing of political power. Why not go along with the majority? The path to political power is always easier that way. The life of an underdog is never easy and the path is always fraught with obstacles. Again, intent says a lot.

A hardcore, uncompromising message always appeals to Libertarians such as myself. It is the promise of reaching that final destination aboard the Freedom Train. Unfortunately, reality is much harder to deal with. I am now 42 years old. Will I live to see real freedom in my time? Very doubtful. However, I will be joyous beyond belief if we receive some small, but significant advancements. I hate taxes, but I'd love to have a much smaller tax burden. I hate the Drug War, but I'd love to see marijuana relegalized. I despise the government “educational” system, but I'd love to see home schooling fully legalized. Granted, these are not exactly visions of Libertopia, but I am sure any of us would be happy to see the above enacted. It's not about compromising one's beliefs, but rather fighting tooth and nail to regain any portion of liberty that has been lost. Every dollar in taxes we don't have to pay is one less dollar in the government's treasury. That is a great thing!

Although Bob Barr doesn't represent libertarianism at it's most hardcore level, his campaign promises a more libertarian America. Before we can regain those liberties in the political arena, we have to be able to enter that arena. Bob Barr is a candidate who can get the “foot in the door” for libertarians. He's media savvy, is well known, and credible. Just as important, he will speak to those in his former party who are disaffected by McCain.

Barr continued.

An active Bob Barr campaign should be welcome. It can be an effective tool for all Libertarians – radical and moderate – to further the cause of liberty beyond it's current moribund state. Is some liberty better than none? Clearly, yes. It's up to delegates to decide whether they want more liberty or remain satisfied with the status quo of diminishing freedoms in favor of an "all or nothing" approach. I strongly encourage delegates to consider the alternatives and support the best candidate going into Denver: Bob Barr!

Why Small Government Republicans should vote for Bob Barr.

The libertarian element within the Republican Party (RP) is still very weak. For those wishing to reform the RP – good luck. Just remember the recent flagrant abuse of the Ron Paul campaign by the RP! Strengthening the Libertarian Party (LP) by supporting Bob Barr serves several purposes:

- Members of the Executive Committee of the RP only respect groups that can win elections for them or cause them to lose elections.

- ⇒ If Bob Barr and the Libertarian Party are on the ballot in many states Bob Barr will wind up taking votes away from John McCain.
- ⇒ John McCain's desires to perpetuate Bush foreign and domestic policies are incredibly dangerous for this country.
- ⇒ Democrats and Libertarians share the concerns about civil liberties. The mistreatment of Habeas Corpus, privacy rights, and the drug war are important issues. If the Democrats and Republicans are unwilling to support such issues alternatives need to be sought. A strong Libertarian Party brings additional attention to such issues. Supporting Bob Barr brings greater pressure to bear on both parties to curb their candidates and office holders when it comes to violating the Bill of Rights.
- ⇒ The ill treatment of third parties and independents needs to be addressed and resolved.
- ⇒ Barack Obama can't win Alabama.

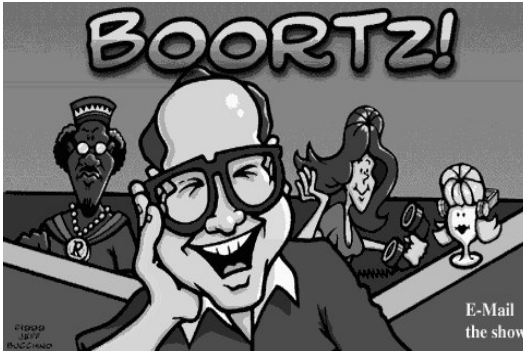

Book Review

Life, Liberty, and Happiness An Optimist Manifesto

Frank Robinson's world view is laid out for the entire world to see. In a nutshell, I am sure that it is a strange view for anyone that is not a libertarian and for libertarians it is strangely optimistic.

Libertarians tend to be very critical of the status quo and the current balance of power when it comes to society. They tend towards cynicism and often defeatism. Whenever you have an ideal, reality provides many examples that are contrary to that ideal and therein emerges a frustrated idealist. This book tries to alter those emotional conclusions by providing good intellectual reasons for optimism.

I have often described my own beliefs as a blend of Humanism, Trans-humanism, and Libertarianism. It is kind of fun finding someone else that has apparently read and studied the same books that I have, experienced the same culture, and arrived at many of the same conclusions. Not all, of course!

Fundamentally, this book is a review of all the myriad of reasons that many of us "became" libertarians. It provides historical anecdotes and references galore to back up libertarian conclusions.

It is easy fun reading and one can jump anywhere. The references are useful and could be good ammunition in a debate. It is clearly written and even the positions that I disagree with are well defended.

My only real criticisms are that Frank Robinson stops too early. The questions of creating a world filled with libertarians...or of popularizing these ideas are not answered. Solutions to the world around us are offered but transitioning and promoting those solutions is an area not well explored.

Frank Robinson's conclusions about the power of the individual and the marketplace to advance human kind trumps all cynicism. His view of society steadily improving itself (over all) carries the day!

Happiness is directly connected with freedom! This is wonderfully established throughout the book and the possibilities of a future that takes us to unimaginable heights is well developed.

Unfortunately, due to media bias and ill treatment by the courts our vote totals were marginal.

Many people blame the current state of the Libertarian movement on lackluster volunteers . I must disagree. I have seen some of our folks devote such time and resources to our cause as to have themselves reduced to a state of poverty.

The lack of resources is the real blame. Historically our volunteers have always had to work with the most sparse of resources and a minimal amount of participation by our membership.

This could all change with real patronage.

We need wealthy patrons.

Libertarians cannot expect others to sacrifice themselves repeatedly without compensation. We all wish that others would fight our fights for us. What makes us libertarians is the realization that we have a primary responsibility to fight these fights. Want to be free? You are going to have to pay for it.

We have to have real fiscal foundations from which to continue our work for any long term progress to be realized.

Sounds like a marketplace? Better believe it.

How to be a powerful minority!

- One must be consistent.
- In light of new information, one must be willing to adapt to the truth.
- Seek allies and gain power from others who agree with you on one or two issues.
- When one is a severe minority one tends to be disliked...so be likeable! Use humor and optimism.
- **Don't ask people to change their minds without introducing them to new information!**
- Use credible outsiders to support your position. They should not appear to have any vested interest in your position.

COUNTERPOINT: What is an Anarcho-Capitalist to do?

When you are outnumbered hundreds of thousands to one, how does one fight the leviathan?

One of the most powerful forces that can counter government power is simply ignoring those laws that are flagrant violations of fundamental rights. Civil disobedience has been an effective tool historically in altering society for the better. The keys to the success of this strategy are one must have a real ethical argument backing you up, one must be willing to be public about it, one must be willing to encourage others to also ignore the bad law, and a large portion of the populace must be willing to do the same or at least agree with you openly. From such a process can emerge powerful change.

Too dangerous?

Here's another one.

Get rich. We need more wealthy libertarians that are willing to support the movement. As the American revolution emerged from the efforts of some very wealthy individuals so can the next revolution. Since we are lacking in numbers we have to make up for it in sheer quality. Imagine a libertarian movement composed of billionaires.

Fighting the system politically is one of the most difficult roads imaginable. Stops are created by our competition on every turn. Our recent history is rife with examples. In 1999 we collected over 60,000 signatures at great expense to get our party on the ballot. In 2000 we ran a small selection of candidates and Sydney Al Smith got 20% in a state-wide race insuring continued ballot access. The Secretary of State originally denied us major party status and we appealed and won. In 2002 we ran 58 candidates from dog catcher to governor. We did everything in our power to fulfill our duties as a political party. Libertarian gubernatorial candidate John Sophocleus was denied entry into the debates. We appealed and lost. Despite our best efforts we were treated with disrespect and shunted to the side by the media.
